Library users should also be aware of other business-oriented materials available at their library branches. These materials offer a variety of resources to aid individuals in marketing, personal financial management, business opportunities, job hunting and investments.

Both the main branch library in La Plata and the P.D. Brown Memorial Library branch in Waldorf/St. Charles subscribe to the following Standard and Poor's publications:

"Corporation Records," financial data on more than 10,000 companies; "The Outlook" a weekly stock advisory guide; "Stock Guide," monthly financial summary of more than 5,000 stocks; "Bond Guide," monthly data on more than 5,000 corporate bonds; "Register of Corportions, Directors, and Executives," a three-volume directory of more than 45,000 corporations and their executives.

In addition, the main branch in

La Plata also receives these Standard & Poor's materials:

"Creditweek," a weekly analytical and rating review of the fixedincome market; "Industry Surveys," two volumes of economic analysis and data on 65 industries; "Statistical Service" monthly revised business/financial statistics; "Dividend Record," details on more than 10,000 dividend amounts, dates and rights; "Stock Reports," quarterly reports on New York, American and Over the Counter stocks. Older editions of these reports are also at the other library branches.

All library branches have "Thomas Register of American Manufacturers." This source identifies more than 135,000 American companies which provide more than 50,000 products and services. Thomas helps find names, locations, and phone numbers for companies as well as their sales offices, plants, service/engineering office. Further, more than 1200 companies provide catalogs of their products to Thomas.

Charles County Public Library branches also subscribe to a number of business magazines.

These include "Forbes," "Fortune," "Business Week, Inc.," "Money," "Monthly Labor Review," "Working Woman," "Venture," and "Best's Review (Life) and Health Insurance Edition." The La Plata and Waldorf branches receive the daily "Wall Street Journal." Check with local branch librarian to determine which branch subscribes to the magazines.
