Plans for Brown library approved a decade ago

Ten years ago, the county commissioners agreed on a building plan for the current P.D. Brown library in St. Charles.

According to the July 19, 1978, edition of the Maryland Independent, the Charles County commissioners approved one of two financing plans suggested by the county library board and St. Charles Associates, the new town's developer.

According to Commissioner President Raymond Tilghman, the plan allows the library to be constructed without any county front money.

st. Charles Associates has agreed to construct the 8,000-square-foot building in Smallwood Village Shopping Center on St. Charles Parkway. In turn, the county will pay a \$4 per square foot lease. At the end of 20 years, the property automatically will revert to the county.
